Who are we?

The Anglican family of St Paul's Manly has a long and vibrant history, testament to the dedication and faith of many committed individuals. Anglican ministry commenced in the Wynnum-Manly area in 1890, with a worship at Manly starting fourteen years later in 1904. We have worshipped in many locations including Tingalpa, Gumdale and Lota. St Paul's has always shown a willingness and ability to adapt to the times, just as Jesus did all those years ago. Whether the adoption of new technologies or moving sites to our present home at Edwin Marsden (E.M.) Tooth Memorial Residential Aged Care – Anglicare, we know that our parish is more than a building – we are a family!

You've probably heard of our Parish. We're the community that in 2022 chose to sell our church, hall, rectory and land to our neighbours – Manly State School and relocate just a few hundred metres down the road. We are now worshiping in the Chapel of the heritage listed Lota House [Anglicare facility] welcoming residents and newcomers. Being able to re-connect and extend worship has been uplifting. We also look forward to the planned addition of The Village Manly, and its additional residents in coming years.

We remain close friends with Education Queensland and look forward to watching our former church be developed into a Student Performance Centre. New life will emerge in our former sacred space for future generations, and we will be able to visit public performances. Plans also include play and leisure areas, along with additional classrooms.

Opportunities and Threats

Our parish is fortunate to have a strong presence of elderly faithful parishioners who bring wisdom and experience to our community. We welcome younger members to our church, and there is an opportunity for us to further engage and involve them in our parish life. We wish to continue to explore ways to expand our congregation, strengthen our financial stability, and foster active participation and commitment from our younger parishioners. Together, we can continue to nurture a diverse and interconnected church family.

Finances

Historically, revenue from collections and fund-raising has been in long-run decline. The sale of the church property in 2022 created two property accounts and lifted burdensome building and maintenance costs off the Parish. The Parish has Diocesan approval to access these accounts for capital works to the chapel and to meet ongoing operating costs. This supports a five year runway to return to financial sustainability.

These funds allow us to support a priest up to a full-time capacity for 5 years. We are willing and open to consider both part-time and full-time candidates.



- The bayside suburb of Manly is an ideal place for families to grow and for people to engage in activities ranging from sports and music, sailing and the arts through to movies, coffee, shops and restaurants. There are six State Primary schools within the parish boundaries and two State High Schools. In addition, there are four private schools catering for primary and/or high school age groups. There are excellent transport options to Brisbane city for work, further education or leisure and all that the state capital can provide. Road, rail and bus connections to the international and domestic airports are within easy reach. The climate is sub-tropical giving us warm to hot summers (average 29°C) and mild winters (average 21°C).
- The parish of St Paul's Manly works closely with our neighbours St Peter's Wynnum.
- St Paul's Manly proudly identifies as an Inclusive Church. The congregation gathers for worship at the E.M Memorial Residential Aged Care chapel. Notably, a number of residents have become regular parishioners from diverse denominational faiths.
